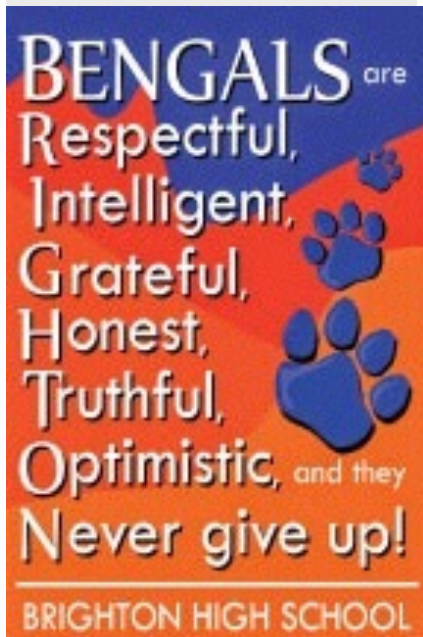

 will be given to only 11th Grade Students
TUESDAY, MARCH 3, 2015.

*ALL 11th grade students will be allowed in the school building
 while the ACT Test is being given from 7:30 a.m. until 11:25 am on Tuesday, March 3, 2015*

9th Grade, 10th Grade and 12th Grade students cannot be in the school until 11:30 a.m. Therefore, Brighton High School will be on an adjusted time schedule for classes and buses.

Parents of 9th, 10th, and 12th Grade Students:

On Tuesday, March 3, 2015, all 9th, 10th and 12th grade students will report at 11:30 a.m. for lunch and 1st period will begin at 12:05 p.m. The first bus run is for the *junior students only* and the second bus run will be made for all other students. Please review the bus schedule on Brighton’s website after Monday, February 9, 2015.

Parents of 11th Grade Students:

Your student will attend a PRE ACT TEST REGISTRATION during their history class on Monday, February 9 or they will be invited to attend a pre-registration on Tuesday, February 10, 2015 in the Media Center at 7 a.m. Pre-registration will also be available on Wednesday, February 18, 2015 and Wednesday, February 25, 2015 at 7 a.m. or 2:30 pm in the Media Center. Pre-registration must be completed by February 25, 2015. Pre-registration cannot be done on the day of testing; it must be completed by February 25, 2015.

Bring to the test: Approved Calculator, Photo Identification, and Sharpened soft lead No. 2 pencils with good erasers. Calculator and snacks are optional.

Do not bring: Books, dictionaries, notes, scratch paper, or any unapproved testing aids
 Highlight pens, colored pens or pencils, or correction fluid
 ANY electronic device other than a permitted calculator (examples include timer, cell phone, media player, headphones, IPAD). **ELECTRONIC DEVICES CANNOT** be used during any breaks anywhere in the building.
 Reading material, **BACK PACK.**

All students except the 11th grade students involved in programs away from school in the morning or the afternoon will be expected to attend their off-campus programs at the regularly schedule times.

Students at Brighton have the exciting opportunity to earn college credit while in high school through the Concurrent Enrollment program. Brighton High School students can take classes here at Brighton that will earn college credit through Salt Lake Community College. This is a great time and money saving opportunity. It will cost the student approximately \$40 to register at the college and then \$5 per credit hour. A 4 credit class will cost the student around \$60. Compare that to the \$300-\$400 it would cost to take the same class on campus. That is a great savings!

The Math and English classes require a qualifying score on either the ACT or the



Accuplacer test given through the college. We will be offering the Accuplacer test here at Brighton High School in April to help the student

qualify for these classes. To see if you qualify or for more information on the Accuplacer test, please come see Ms. Hodges, Ms. Reynolds or Ms. Staten in the CTE office.
